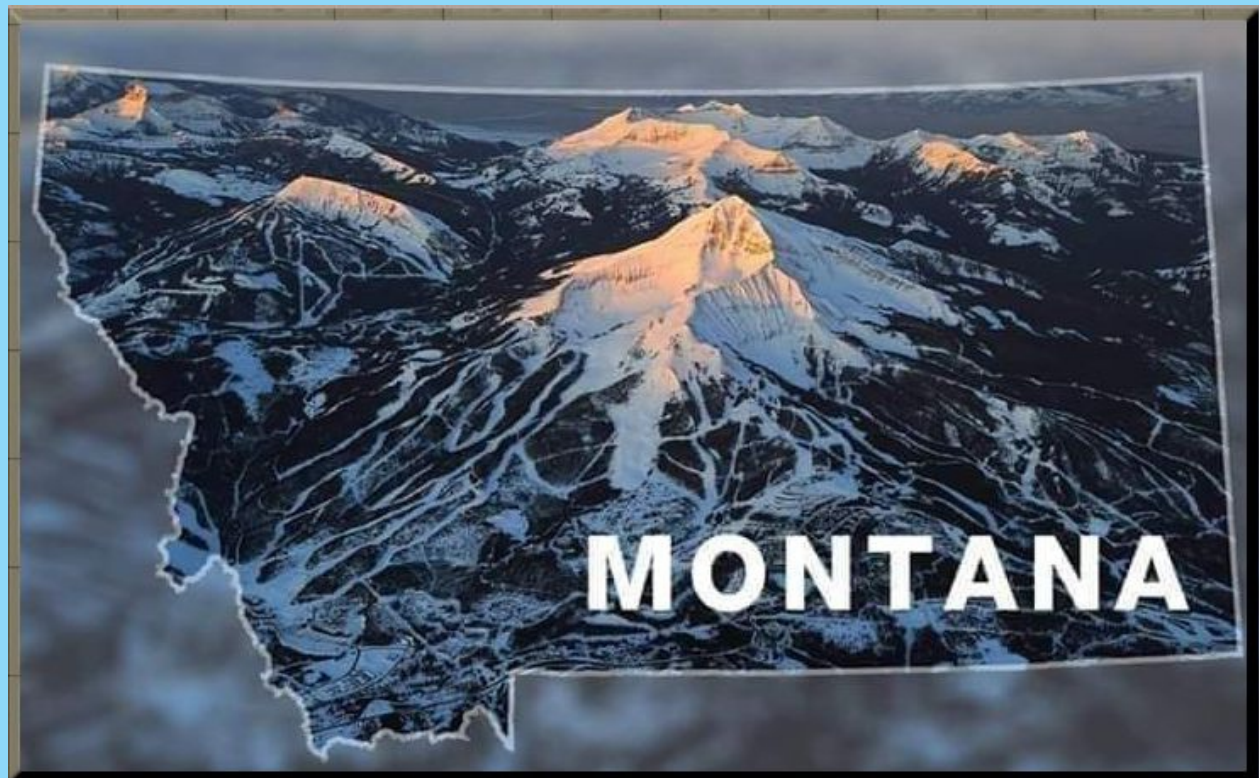

Our History



old Church 1887

A church has been well defined as “A Group of People Worshipping”. It was such a group, 12 members strong, who on a Sunday in June of 1886 organized the First Presbyterian Church of Great Falls. It was the first church to be established in the city of Great Falls, and was to become the largest Presbyterian Church in the state of Montana.

The first service was held in the school house with 12 members present. In 1887 church members purchased

land and built their first church, it was a “school house” type structure with a belfry. As the congregation grew, so did the church, with a sunday school wing being added in 1892. In 1903 the wooden structure was replaced by a stone building. That survived until 1929 when water

damage forced its condemnation. A new plot was purchased, and they completed the construction of our present building in 1931. Many of the stained glass windows you will see in the present chapel were removed from the old stone church building and reinstalled in the present building.

Over the years this building too was expanded to include the Cowan wing with classrooms, and the office wing. The construction was done in a manner to create a beautiful garth (courtyard) which is where we now hold many community functions such as our Ice Cream Social and the Blessing of the Animals.

In 1977 a mortgage burning ceremony was held and the church was debt free!

Outreach

At FPCGF we are very proud of our many outreach programs. We have an annual Blessing of the Animals that is open and available to both church members and the community, as is our annual Ice Cream Social. We hold two Mid-week ministries, "Dinner and a Movie" focused on adults. A pot luck dinner is served and followed up with a movie, currently we're showing "The Chosen". Our second Mid-week ministry is geared toward the children, and features snacks and Bible study. We have members that help serve in our local rescue mission, and members that volunteer at a local elementary school to assist students in their reading skills. On a rotating basis between a dozen other churches, we staff a program called FISH which is a Christian based outreach program that works out of our local food bank. We man the facility for a full week once every quarter. Those in need of food go through Opportunity Inc. where they are screened and approved, then sent to us where we provide them with much needed groceries.



One of our most successful programs is the founding of Peace Place. It is dedicated to providing accessible, high-quality, and completely free respite care for families raising children with special needs. We are very proud that it was one of our members, actually the wife of a previous pastor, that wrote the government grant and got it approved. That grant provided the funds to start Peace Place in Great Falls. Started in 2011 Peace Place began by offering just one respite session per week. Over time, community need and program success led to significant growth. Peace Place now serves 30+ children each week, offering two respite programs (morning and after-school) five days a week. Since its inception, Peace Place has provided over 10,000 individual respite sessions to dozens of families throughout our community. Since its beginning Peace Place operated out of our church. Due to its success and growth, Peace Place was able to attain 501(c)(3) nonprofit status. It is now an independent organization enabling it to better serve our rapidly growing number of families in need of respite care. Today, Peace Place operates as a fully independent organization in it's own location.



Blessing of the Animals

One of our longest running outreach programs is Souler Energy. Our Sunday Service is recorded and rebroadcast on a local TV station. It now reaches over 3400 people over an area of several hundred miles in all directions. Thanks to the generous donations made by our "TV Congregation" the program funds itself. Our Sunday service is also available live streamed on Youtube, and garners hundreds of views by itself.

Our Goals

We believe that Christ has called us to move forward, to be a renewed church in His image. He is calling a new pastor to us to help us transform into being that new church. Our new pastor will lead us into being a church sensitive to tomorrow's spiritual needs. A church that nurtures growth and deepens our faith and trust in God.

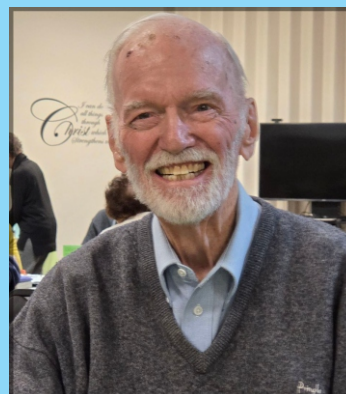


Scott Royce; *Property Committee Moderator*

Compassion & Empathy: Understand the personal and spiritual needs of those around you and can give them understanding of their individual needs, and the spiritual guidance they seek.

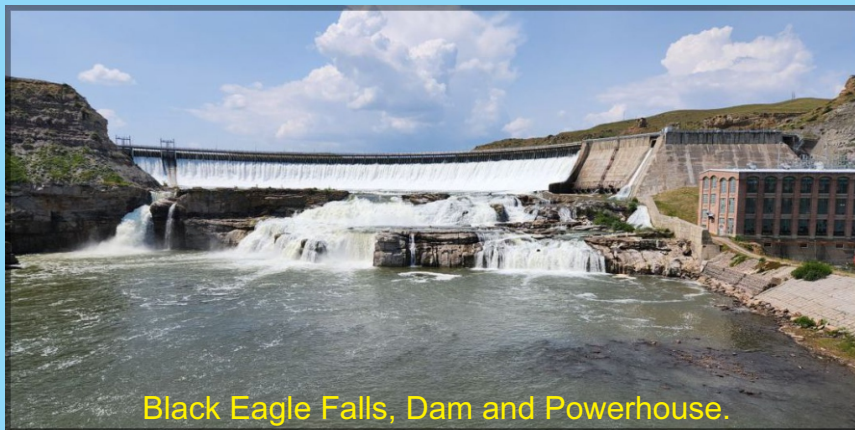
Ability to Deliver Topical & Relevant Messages from the Bible: Make God's word meaningful in today's world.

You will work closely with Session's vision and strategy in doing God's work for Great Falls First Presbyterian Church. Your primary responsibilities will be teaching, evangelism and prayer ministry, in addition you will be overseeing and directing all church activities and needs. Starting with a good Pastoral heart, our pastor should be a Christ-centered theologically traditional reformed Bible based leader. You will encourage individuals to seek their God-given talents and resources, and encourage members to use them in service to the church and our missions in a true team fashion.

Welcome To Great Falls

Great Falls is located, and encompasses several of the five “great waterfalls” of the Missouri River. It lies near the center of Montana on the northern Great Plains, just off the eastern front of the Rocky Mountains. It is approximately 100 miles south of the US - Canada border and has a total area of 22.26 square miles. The city boasts 57 neighborhood parks, a water park, and the River's Edge Trail that covers almost 60 miles along both sides of the Missouri River. The Great Falls Public Library has served the city for over 140 years and partners with the Little Free Library program.

There are 20 schools within the Great Falls school system, including two high schools, an alternative high school, two middle schools, and 15 elementary schools. Great Falls is also the home to the state-operated Montana School for the Deaf & Blind.

We are also home to three institutions of higher education; Great Falls College Montana State University, a two-year school which has been a part of the Montana University System since

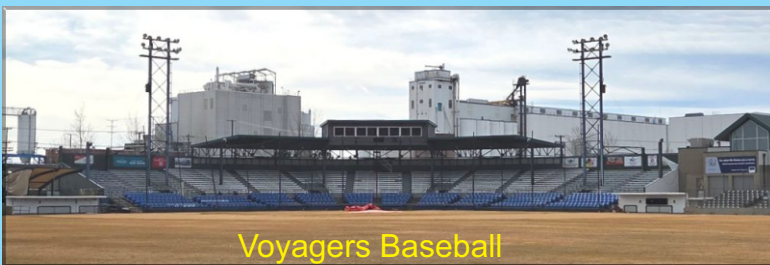
1994; The University of Providence, a private four-year Catholic university, and since August of 2023 Great Falls has been home to the Touro College of Osteopathic Medicine. It is part of the New York-based Touro University System and is the first Medical School in Montana.

Besides all the educational opportunities, Great Falls offers a lot of family entertainment. The Great Falls Symphony performs a full season and the Great Falls Municipal Band performs a free

Concerts-in-the-Park series during the summer. Summers also bring a weekly Farmers' Market, auto racing at the Electric City Speedway, and we are home to a professional baseball team, the Voyagers. The Voyagers play in the independent Pioneer league, which is a major league baseball partner league.

Economic results for 2025Q3 was published by the national JobsEQ system we utilize to track employment, wages, occupation and industry data. The average annual wage in the Great Falls MSA (Cascade County) grew by 6.3% in the 12 months ending in 2025Q3 reaching \$56,955. That was higher growth than the Montana state average at 5.5% or the national average at 4.1%. In 12 months, the local average annual wage increased by \$3,381. In the same 12 month period, total annual wages earned in the Great Falls MSA increased by \$124 million.

For thousands of years indigenous peoples inhabited what would be Montana. The Louisiana Purchase in 1803 included this land, and it was explored during the Lewis and Clark Expedition (1804-1806). The first permanent settlement by Euro-Americans was St. Mary's, established in 1841 near present-day Stevensville.

The Montana Territory was established in 1864 and Montana officially became the 41st state on November 8, 1889.

1. Quality of Life in Montana

Montana is the fourth largest state and is where community comes first. While you will find larger cities throughout the state, the majority of towns are small, charming and

family-friendly. Billings, the largest city in Montana, has a population of approximately 120,000, with Great Falls coming in third with a population right at 61,000. However, most communities throughout the Treasure State have fewer than 20,000 residents, with many in the 1000 to 5000 range. Throughout Montana, you'll typically find low crime rates, family-friendly festivals, many mom-and-pop shops, exceptional city parks, and a neighborly

atmosphere where life seems to go just a little bit slower—connections between family and friends are a priority.

2. Education and Family-Friendly Amenities

If you're in that stage of life that you have young kids, then education is probably at the top of your list of priorities when it comes to considering the best place to answer your calling. And to help strengthen the decision to move to the Treasure State even more,

Montana is ranked as one of the top 20 most educated states in America. What's more is that Montana out ranks all of the surrounding states; Idaho, Wyoming, North Dakota, and South Dakota. Montana also ranked third in the country for the highest percentage of school diploma holders. We are proud of our two universities, the University of Montana in Missoula (the Grizzlies), and the Montana State University (the Bobcats) located in Bozeman.



3. Natural Beauty and Outdoor Activities

Montana is a wonderland if you and your family love outdoor activities such as camping, hiking, fishing, boating and floating our rivers; with winters of skiing, snowmobiling and ice fishing.

Great Falls sits just between two of our nations most beautiful national

parks; Glacier just to the north, and Yellowstone just a short drive south. Most children love growing up with memories of family outings in the outdoors, and their weekends are rarely spent indoors; instead, you'll find them mountain biking, playing sports, or camping. They live for lake days filled with



swimming, kayaking, and fishing. This lifestyle is easy to find in Montana. With 55 state parks and nine National Park Service sites—including our two national parks—there's no shortage of places to explore. And when you add in the state's jaw-dropping scenery, it's easy to see why so many people fall in love with Montana's great outdoors. There are so many reasons to live in Montana, but if you have a young family, the list can be even more extensive.
